Last year was an exciting year. The 2022 camp sessions were a hit! Three sessions were held between July 10th and 30th. Each session was almost at capacity with 62 campers in the first session, 62 campers in the second, and 38 in the third.



Last year's theme was "Undefeated". Each day campers experienced devotionals, Bible classes, sermons and individual study, along with an entire week of time strengthening relationships with old friends as well as making new ones. Each evening during chapel the campers, along with many visitors, heard wonderful lessons that capped off the topic of the day. This was also a time for uplifting their voices to God in song. There were a various men who volunteered to present lessons last year. We are so grateful to have so many men who are willing to take the time to prepare lessons.

During the sessions we were blessed to have 2 campers respond to the invitation and put on Christ in baptism!

Last year's group of campers were part of a special group who were able to enjoy all-new cabins with air-conditioning! Along with the three camp sessions, there was a 2-day Ladies Retreat and a 2-day Mens Retreat. The Ladies Retreat was held on Sep. 10th-11th and the Mens Retreat was held on Sep. 16th-17th. The Ladies and Mens Retreat was a huge success with many attending from surrounding congregations. The youth utilized the camp facilities a few times for their monthly youth get-together. These opportunities are yet another way that Christians, or those preparing to become Christians, can come to learn more from God's word, edify one another, and build relationships.

Renovation—What's Next?

As most know, the facilities of Little Blue have been around for many years and have reached the end of their usable life. Over the past 2 years, there has been a lot of work done to repair or replace some of these structures, making sure they are still safe for our campers' use. Last year we completed a 2-year project replacing all 6 of the cabins. This was a well-needed renovation, and the new cabins look great! As an added bonus, each cabin received an airconditioner to allow some reprieve from the July heat. In addition to building the new cabins, we removed some trees, allowing for repositioning of cabins 4 and 5, grading of the grounds around the cabins, and a new set of steps on the girls' side of the camp.

Even after all that work, there is still a lot that needs to be addressed. With so many projects that need to be completed and only so much available funds, the board has been working on a plan to prioritize projects by greatest need. Although the plan is not completely finished, it has been unanimous that the next project that will be our focus is the bathroom/shower house. This building is in need of a complete remodel. As you can imagine, a complete remodel is quite expensive and cannot be done all at once. We are working to make the most impact with the funds we currently have.

Improvements begins one project at a time!

Here is a list of projects that the board has determined to be the oreatest needs for Little Blue:

- 1. Demo and remodel the bathroom and shower house
- 2. Remodel the Directors/ Cooks cabin
- 3. Tear down and replace the activity barn
- 4. Remodel Mess Hall
- 5. Replace concrete and replace goal in Basketball court area
- 6. Remodel Chapel
- 7. Install a sand volleyball area

Courage Like David

When David entered the Israelite camp in I Sam 17, he was appalled to witness Goliath, the Philistine champion, mocking God and his people. And even though he was considered to be a "youth" (:33), he was not afraid to go out and fight Goliath. David understood that he would not be facing Goliath alone. God would be on his side and would deliver him (:45-46). We see David defeat Goliath with a sling and a rock (:49).

David would not have had the confidence needed to defeat Goliath if he did not have faith and full trust in God. That is one of the goals of the Little Blue Bible Camp—to instill confidence in each camper by helping establish their faith and trust in God. This confidence is needed to defeat the "Goliaths" Satan will send to battle each camper throughout life, Satan is always looking for ways to defeat us (IPe 5:8). Just as David was armed to do battle with Goliath, we attempt to help arm each camper with the armor that God has supplied through study of His word (Eph 6:ID-18). Psa 31:24 "Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the LORD."
